WHO IS ROSA PARKS?

How do people get mentioned in history books or encyclopedias? Whose lives get books written, whose birthdays are celebrated by millions? How many other lives can one person's life change?



It was Rosa Louise Parks' desire to defend herself, her conscience and her being able to seek for her rights were what made her unforgettable.

She did what most people wouldn't dare to do. She was strong enough to be a hero. She shared her strength with the powerless, she gave them confidence, she held hands with many heroes, and she raised the bar a little higher. That's why Rosa Parks became an important female figure in history.

Rosa Parks was born on February 4, 1913 in Tuskegee, Alabama. Her father James McCauley was a carpenter and her mother Leona was a teacher. After her parents' separation, she started to live with her mother She moved to the Pine Level area near Montgomery. She grew up on a farm with her mother, grandfather, grandmother and older brother Sylvester. She got enrolled in the Industrial Girls' School in Montgomery, where her aunt lived. She took academic and professional courses there. She began her secondary education at Alabama State Negro Teachers' College; However, she had to drop out of school to care for her grandmother and later her mother.

In 1932, Rosa and Raymond Parks got married in Montgomery. She worked a variety of jobs, including being a hospital maid and domestic maid. She completed her education with the support of her husband in 1933. At the time less than 7% of African Americans had a high school diploma.

Under Jim Crow laws, there was racial discrimination in the South in every aspect of life, including public buses. Bus and train companies did not allocate separate vehicles for different races; But there were seating plans that the blacks had to follow. They were implementing it. In Montgomery, the first rows of buses belonged to the whites. For black people, who made up 75% of the passengers, there were seats designated by color at the back of the bus. They were forbidden to sit in the middle seats. When the seats designated for white passengers were full, blacks had to give up their seats and, if necessary, get off the bus. Depending on the driver's request, the backseats on buses where they were supposed to sit were sometimes removed. For years, black people complained about this injustice that affected them.

NOVEMBER

What Rosa Parks experienced on December 1, 1955 was an ordinary occurrence that thousands of black people experienced every day, until Rosa's resistance.



It was an ordinary day for Rosa Parks, she had left her job and boarded on her regular line bus. She sat down in a seat towards the middle of the bus that was colored for her to sit in, but after three stops the driver pointed at four black people, including Rosa, to give up their seats for the white people who had just boarded and asked them to vacate the seats as soon as possible. Except for Rosa they all reluctantly did as they were told. She remained in her seat.

The driver came up to Rosa and told her that if she didn't get up, he would call the police and have her arrested. Ro-

sa's attitude was firm: "You can do as you wish,"she replied. So Rosa Parks was arrested under Mongomery law, but this arrest was the end of the silence of a race, and her resistance galvanized hundreds of people, within a few months, thousands of people.

Black organizational leaders began preparations for a boycott and the fight for equality started by Rosa Parks led to the birth of one of the most important heroes of recent history: Rosa was a respected member of not only the black community but also Montgomery. She was one of the few people to speak out against segregation in Montgomery in recent years.

The Montgomery bus boycott was an unexpected success, with blacks walking to work in the mornings, riding bicycles, or sometimes taking taxis in droves. The buses carried only white passengers, and when the bus companies, which did not care about the boycott at first, later started to make losses, violence broke out. The boycott was described as a terrorist act; However, the companies, which had lost 75% of their passengers, could not resist any longer and after 382 days, the racist practices of the buses were removed. After her arrest, Rosa Parks experienced many hardships. She was fired from her job for no reason; her husband also had to quit his job.

In 1979 Rosa Parks was awarded the NAACP's Spingarn Medal. The following year, she was awarded by Martin Luther King Jr. and acclaimed as the person who did what no one else could do and said what no one else could say. She went down in history as someone who demanded equality, called for justice, and without hesitation defended her community.

This was how the name of Rosa Parks, who throughout her life was never ashamed of her race, her history or her identity was carved into history.

If Rosa Parks had given up her seat that day, if she hadn't acclaimed her rightful cause, if she had been afraid and turned her back on reality, if she had not fought in the hope of being an example for the fight of thousands of people, today would have been very different.

"Neglected Autumn: Climate Change's Overlooked Season"

Climate change is a pressing issue that has garnered significant attention in recent years. Scientists and environmentalists have been sounding the alarm about the catastrophic effects of climate change on our planet. However, there is one season that often gets overlooked in the discussions about climate change: autumn. Autumn, often referred to as the "forgotten season" of climate change, is actually a critical period when the effects of global warming become evident.

As temperatures rise and weather patterns shift, autumn is experiencing significant changes that have implications. One of the key factors contributing to the changing climate in autumn is the diminishing Arctic sea ice cover. Studies have shown that the loss of sea ice in the Arctic can lead to changes in the extratropical regions of the Northern Hemisphere. Liu et al. found out that the decline in autumn Arctic sea ice cover has substantial impacts on the East Asian Winter Monsoon, winter temperatures, and snowstorm activity. These changes in the Arctic can affect weather patterns and climate systems in other parts of the world, including during autumn (*Liu et al.*, 2014).

Another key aspect affected by climate change in autumn in plant phenology. Plant phenology, which refers to the timing of seasonal events in a plant's life cycle, is an important indicator of climate change. While much attention has been given to the earlier arrival of spring and its impact on plant phenology, the changes happening in autumn are equally significant. However, the study of fall phenology is still relatively limited when compared to spring phenology.

Another important aspect of autumn in the context of global warming and climate change is its impact on terrestrial vegetation (terrestrial vegetation refers to the plant communities that occur across the landscapes in the planning area, USDA Forest Service). Terrestrial vegetation plays a vital role in the global carbon cycle and overall ecosystem functioning. The changing climate in autumn can disrupt the balance of terrestrial vegetation, and have consequences. Researchers suggest that the autumn season is particularly sensitive to climate change impacts compared to other seasons, with remarkable implications for carbon fluxes and ecosystem productivity.



FALL RECIPES

Beyza Tanalp 12-B

Autumn is the best season to stay at home under a cozy blanket and enjoy warm baked goods with a cup of hot chocolate. Although, it might be a little depressing to just sit around and wait for it to get warmer, a little treat can always make your not-so-good days better! I think we can all agree that store bought desserts don't really hit the spot when you're craving the taste and heavenly smell of freshly baked ones. So, for all my dear readers with a sweet tooth, here are some recipes that are sure to keep you warm and full during the breezy days of fall.

GINGERBREAD COOKIES

Gingerbread cookies are probably the first type that comes to mind when you think about cold weather. Ginger is the key element of most fall recipes with its sweet and spicy taste that leaves your stomach warm. So this recipe is definitely a classic one you should try following at least once.

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 and 1/2 cups (440g) all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 Tablespoon ground ginger
- 1 Tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 10 Tablespoons (2/3 cup; 145g) unsalted butter
- 3/4 cup (150g) packed light or dark brown sugar
- 2/3 cup (160ml) unsulphured or dark molasses
- 1 large egg
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract



INSTRUCTIONS:

In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, salt, ginger, cinnamon, allspice, and cloves. Set aside.

In a large bowl, beat the butter for 1 minute on medium speed until completely smooth and creamy. Add the brown sugar and molasses and beat on medium high speed until combined and creamy.

Next, beat in egg and vanilla on high speed for 2 full minutes.

Add the flour mixture to the wet ingredients, and beat on low speed until combined. The cookie dough will be quite thick and slightly sticky. Divide dough in half and place each onto a large piece of plastic wrap. Wrap each up tightly and pat down to create a disc shape. Chill discs for at least 3 hours and up to 3 days. Chilling is mandatory for this cookie dough.

Preheat oven to 180°C. Line 2-3 large baking sheets with parchment paper. Set aside.

NOVEMBER

Remove 1 disc of chilled cookie dough from the refrigerator. Generously flour a work surface, as well as your hands and the rolling pin. Roll out the disc until around 1cm thick. Cut into shapes. Place shapes at least 3 centimeters apart on prepared baking sheets. Re-roll dough scraps until all the dough is shaped. Repeat with remaining discs of dough.

CINNAMON ROLLS

This next dessert is soft, fluffy, creamy and tastes heavenly as well as its mouth-watering smell. Cinnamon is one of my personal favorite spices so I highly recommend trying out this recipe.

INGREDIENTS:

For the dough:

34 cup warm milk

2 ¼ teaspoons quick rise or active yeast

¼ cup granulated sugar

1 egg plus 1 egg yolk

¼ cup butter, melted

3 cups bread flour, plus more for dusting

3/4 teaspoon salt

For the filling:

2/3 cup brown sugar

1 1/2 tablespoons ground cinnamon

¼ cup butter, softened

For the cream cheese frosting:

½ cup cream cheese, softened

3 tablespoons butter, softened

34 cup powdered sugar

½ teaspoon vanilla extract



INSTRUCTIONS:

Transfer warm milk to your bowl and sprinkle yeast on top. Add in sugar, egg, egg yolk and melted butter. Mix until well combined. Next, stir in flour and salt with a wooden spoon until a dough begins to form.

Place dough hook on stand mixer and knead dough on medium speed for 8 minutes. Dough should form into a nice ball and be slightly sticky. If you don't want to use an electric mixer, you can use your hands to knead the dough for 8-10 minutes on a well-floured surface.

Transfer the dough ball to a well-oiled bowl, cover with plastic wrap and a warm towel. Allow dough to rise for 1 hour to 1½ hours, or until doubled in size.

After the dough has doubled in size, transfer dough to a well-floured surface and roll out into a 35x25 cm rectangle. Spread softened butter over dough, leaving a 2/3 cm margin at the far side of the dough.

NOVEMBER

In a small bowl, mix together brown sugar and cinnamon. Use your hands to sprinkle mixture over the buttered dough, then rub the brown sugar mixture into the butter.

Tightly roll dough up, starting from the 25 cm side and place seam side down making sure to seal the edges of the dough as best you can.

Cut into 3 cm sections with a serrated knife or floss. You should get 9 large pieces.

Place cinnamon rolls in a greased 25 x 25 cm baking pan or round 25 cm cake pan. Line with parchment paper. Cover with plastic wrap and a warm towel and let rise again for 30-45 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 180 degrees C. Remove plastic wrap and towel and bake cinnamon rolls for 20-25 minutes or until just slightly golden brown on the edges. You want to underbake them a little so they stay soft in the middle, that's why we want them just slightly golden brown. Allow them to cool for 5-10 minutes before frosting.

To make the frosting: In the bowl of an electric mixer, combine cream cheese, butter, powdered sugar and vanilla extract. Beat until smooth and fluffy. Spread over cinnamon rolls and serve immediately.

HOMEMADE HOT CHOCOLATE

And of course, these goods wouldn't be as enjoyable if they didn't have a warm drink to accompany them. A homemade cup of hot chocolate is better than anything you can drink on a cold autumn day.

INGREDIENTS:

4 cups milk

¼ cup unsweetened cocoa powder

14 cup granulated sugar

½ cup chocolate chips or chopped chocolate bar

¼ teaspoon pure vanilla extract

INSTRUCTIONS:

Place milk, cocoa powder and sugar in a small saucepan. Heat over medium/medium-low heat, whisking frequently, until warm (but not boiling). Add chocolate chips and whisk constantly until the chocolate chips melt and distribute evenly into the milk. Whisk in vanilla extract, serve immediately.

For a better taste, you can add in small marshmallows.




SENSATIONAL REVOLUTION OF AUTUMN Havin Akdeve 11-A
